FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How long does it take to get my test results?

Once we receive your samples, results will be available in approximately 5-7 days. For those needing faster service, one-day express testing is available for a \$295 fee.

What is the difference between a "home kit" paternity test and a legal (standard) paternity test?

The primary difference between the two types of tests is the sample collection method. Do-it-yourself "Home Kits" may not be recognized or approved as legal tests in any state and are not offered by DADSDNA™, because they are collected by the test participants, without any witnesses. Legal paternity test samples are collected by a certified third party where your identification will be verified and a photograph may be taken. The purpose of these stringent procedures is to ensure that the participants are who they say they are. DADSDNA™ does not offer home-kit paternity tests.

Are my results admissible in court?

Yes. All DADSDNA™ paternity tests are legal paternity tests, and are admissible in court.

Is a blood sample required?

No. Paternity testing can be performed using a buccal (cheek) swab. It is completely non-invasive, painless and convenient, and is just as accurate as a blood sample.

How are the samples collected?

A sterile swab, very similar to a Q-tip®, is rubbed on the inside of the cheek of both the child and the alleged father. If practical, the mother's DNA should also be sampled, however this is not mandatory for an accurate analysis.

How accurate is DADSDNA paternity testing?

DADSDNA's strict chain of custody ensures error-free results through our proper handling, testing, and analysis of samples. Both buccal (cheek) swab and non-invasive prenatal maternal blood testing provide Probability of Paternity of 99.99% or higher. Probability of Paternity is a statistical measure of the likelihood of a biological relationship between the alleged father and the child. No paternity test will provide a 100% result, because that would mean a laboratory would have to test every man in the world. Instead, Probability of Paternity is calculated using a population database. While an "inclusion" result means at least a 99.99% probability that the alleged father is biologically related to the child, an "exclusion" result is always 0%. That's because if the genetic profiles of the child and alleged father do not match, there is no statistical chance that they are biologically related.

Can a paternity test be performed without the mother?

Yes. Accurate results can be obtained without testing the mother. However, in a small percentage of cases, not including the mother's sample can lead to inconclusive results, therefore it is always recommended to include the mother in the test, if she is available.

How old must a child be to perform DNA testing?

There are no age restrictions. DNA testing can be performed on individuals of any age. Newborns can be tested using either a buccal (cheek) swab or umbilical cord blood - both are easy and painless procedures.

What if the mother, child and alleged father(s) live in different cities/states?

We can accommodate each participant with separate appointment times and/or locations across the U.S. Each kit is identified by a unique laboratory accession number so that all samples can be tested together once received.

Can a paternity test be performed before a child is born?

Yes. Our lab now offers state-of-the-art pre-natal paternity testing. From as early as the 9th week of pregnancy, we can perform this test. The test requires a blood draw from both the mother and the alleged father. Since the mother's blood actually contains fragments of the fetal blood, the lab will identify the fetal blood and compare it to the alleged father's blood to determine paternity.

Can paternity testing also show if the mother is not really the mother?

Yes. Although it's rare, there have been several cases in which non-maternity has been found while performing a routine paternity test.

What if the mother and alleged father are related?

It does not matter, the results are still valid.

Can parentage be determined when the alleged father is deceased?

Yes. There are several options. Blood or buccal (cheek) samples collected at the time of death can be used, tissue specimens from previous surgeries or an autopsy can be used, the deceased's parents can be tested to determine if they are grandparents, or the body can be exhumed and a tissue sample can be obtained for testing.

What if the two alleged fathers are related (i.e. brothers, father-son)?

It is possible for both individuals to have the same or similar genetic markers, therefore both of the alleged fathers need to be tested. If one of them is not available for testing, the laboratory should be informed of these circumstances, as extended marker testing may have to be performed.

Can the alleged father's test results be used in another paternity case?

Yes. But ONLY if the alleged father agrees to it, or there is a court order.

Can different types of biological specimens (such as a buccal/cheek swab from a child and a blood sample from an adult) be used for the same test?

Yes. Because DNA is the same in every cell in your body, analysis performed on cheek cells is the same as analysis performed on blood cells.

Can I change my DNA by drinking alcohol or taking drugs?

No. DNA patterns are not altered by such things as drinking, eating, medication, or age.

Do I need a doctor's or attorney's order to have the paternity test performed?

Only if you live in New York State. New York State law requires a New York licensed physician's prescription, a New York attorney's order, or a court order for all paternity testing. Clinical laboratories cannot perform analysis of samples without a prescription, a New York attorney's order, or court order. DADSDNA™ can arrange all of this for you at no additional charge.

Is paternity testing covered by health insurance?

No. Paternity testing is not considered a medically necessary procedure and therefore is not covered.

Will the results be kept confidential?

Yes. Information of any kind regarding your test will only be available to the individuals tested or other designated representative(s) (i.e. attorneys) when a written authorization is provided.

How will I receive my results?

Reports are sent by email or fax to each adult tested and their designated representative. Reports are also sent via US mail. Due to the sensitive and confidential nature of the test, results will not be provided over the telephone.
